
From everyone at Women Building Futures!

Ree ey graduated from our Journeywoman Start program in 2011 and began her career in welding, eventually finding her way into the field of industrial rope access. She has come back to WBF to guest speak to current students about rope access, welding, and being a woman in a male dominated industry. By sharing her journey, she empowers women to overcome barriers to achieve their dreams. We are so excited to announce that Keeley has been selected as one of 2020's Top 100 Canada's Most Powerful Women awarded by Women's Executive Network.

"When I found out about rope access, I thought it would add to my welding credentials and just make me more employable. At the time, I didn't think it would alter the course of my life plans. As I advanced through the rope access levels, my career began to focus away from welding and center on this new and exciting trade. Without even noticing it, rope access had chosen me and I knew it was what I wanted to do. During advancement in the trade, I began noticing that I was working with less and less female rope technicians . The field of female rope tech's was so small and insignificant to our male counterparts, I knew I wanted to do something to help change it. So, I reached out to Women Building Futures to ask for assistance to put on a Rope Access training course, which would be the first known in the world of entirely female IRATA trainees and taught by a female trainer."
