Status of Women Announces Funding for WBFB

On July 19, WBFB Board Chair Angela Armstrong was thrilled to welcome Terry Duguid, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Status of Women and Member of Parliament for Winnipeg South, to WBFB Housing Facility and Suncor Energy Training Centre for an important funding announcement.

WBFB received \$384,000 from the Government of Canada to fund a three-year project to support the hiring and retention of Indigenous women in the construction, maintenance, and oil & gas sectors.

The project will bring together Indigenous women, employers, and stakeholders to identify barriers and best practices to advance Indigenous women's participation in these industries.

"When women are empowered to succeed in the economy, all Canadians benefit. With these projects, women across Alberta will enjoy greater opportunities to work in several well-paying sectors of our economy. By challenging the barriers that hold women back, Canadian industries can benefit from women's enormous economic potential and leadership skills. This will contribute to their success."

Then I was promoted to Lead Hand so I left the painting crew and jumped into my new role, or so I thought. A month into it I was asked if I would like to become a trainer for Ledcor!

So here I am, teaching snowplow operations both in a classroom setting as well as in a simulator we rented from Alberta Motor Transportation Association. My very short journey with Ledcor has been amazing. My first day on the job was Oct 11, 2016 and here I am, 10 months later - a trainer!"
